



ORDER OF THE EXECUTIVE

Re: Suspension of Limitation Periods in Yuułu?ił?atḥ Enactments

Enacted under the Emergency Preparedness Act section 3.4


BACKGROUND:

- A. On March 30, 2020, pursuant to section 2.4(a) and (b) of the Emergency Preparedness Act, the President declared a state of emergency on all Yuułu?ił?atḥ lands because of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic;
- B. Section 3.4 of the Emergency Preparedness Act provides that while a Yuułu?ił?atḥ emergency declaration is in effect, the Executive may do all acts and implement all procedures that it considers necessary or advisable to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency, health hazard or disaster; and
- C. As a result of the pandemic and public health measures to be taken in response to it, it may not be possible for persons involved in legal or administrative proceedings to take steps required by legislation which may in turn cause significant problems for those persons seeking to enforce their legal rights.

NOW THEREFORE THE EXECUTIVE ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) Effective as of the date of this Order, every mandatory limitation period and any other mandatory time period that is established in a Yuułu?ił?atḥ enactment is suspended until:
 - a. the date on which the emergency declaration made March 30, 2020 under section 2.4(a) of the Emergency Preparedness Act expires or is cancelled, or
 - b. if there is an extension of the emergency declaration under section 2.4(a) of the Emergency Preparedness Act, the date on which the last extension of that declaration expires or is cancelled.
- 2) A person, tribunal or other body that has a statutory power of decision may waive, suspend or extend a mandatory time period relating to the exercise of that power.
