Do Not Consume Notice Update; Water Services Available for hitaću Residents

#### **WATER DELIVERY**

A second delivery of bottled drinking water was distributed to households today. 18 litre jugs have arrived at the Cixwatin Centre for distribution, these jugs will be distributed to homes within the day. A look into family requirements will be considered and additional supplies will be delivered at a later date. We thank UFN staff and community service interns for your help in distribution. Water deliveries will continue daily until the State of Emergency is lifted.

#### **WATER REFILL**

Water refill is available at the Ucluelet Community Centre (UCC) to fill large bottles and jugs. The UCC is open Monday to Friday; 9:00am to 6:00pm and Saturday, Sunday; 10:00am to 6:00pm.

There will be a water pick up, fill up, and distribution through the Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government. If you need your 18 litre jug filled up please call Carrie and Arlene at the **Cix\*atin Centre (250) 726-7342** for pick up and more information regarding this service.

#### WEST COAST MOTEL SHOWER AVAILABILITY

The West Coast Motel has graciously opened their doors to allow hitacu residents access to their showers.

- Showers are available 9:00am to 5:00pm.
- Appointments can be booked at top of the hour.
- Sessions are 30 minutes in length.
- There are three male and three female showers for use.
- A mask must be work and all COVID protocols and provincial health orders are in place.
- The pool and gym will be closed and not included for this time.

Citizens are asked to call Carrie and Arlene at the Cixwatin Centre at (250) 726-7342 to schedule a time. \*Please do not call the West Coast Motel\*. This service will be in place until Monday, January 24 or as needed.

#### **GENERAL UPDATE**

\*\*\*Water may only be used for flushing toilets at this time.\*\*\*

Water trucks have been in the community working to fill and maintain the water levels of the hitaću water tower. Once the water tower has reached a sustainable volume and first round of water testing is complete, restrictions may be eased to allow for sanitary washing and short showers. It will be vital to keep water consumption low when this transition takes place.

In order for the State of Emergency to be lifted the water system needs to be flushed and thorough testing must be done on the tap water to ensure it is safe for consumption. This process will take some time. As more information is gathered, further updates will be issued.
