Residents of hitaču,

There have been slight disruptions at the Cixwatin Centre this week, that we wish to share with the community.

On the morning of Monday, July 11, the Mini Bighouse and connecting offices were found to be flooded. No artifacts were damaged. The Mini Bighouse is currently being dried and further assessed. Office space will need to be repaired and future scheduled events will be moved to alternate locations. There was a service disruption on Thursday, July 14 involving the telephone lines. Callers can call the main line at **250-726-7342**. However, when the automated system answers, we ask that you **dial 201**. This step will take the call to reception.

There was a small electrical fire on Friday, July 15 at the Centre, prompting an evacuation of the staff and a visit from the Ucluelet Fire Department. The issue was identified, and the Centre was cleared as safe. There was no further disruption to community services or staff availability.

Public Works is continuing to request that residents follow the 3 P's when flushing, this includes only flushing pee, poop, and (toilet) paper. Sanitization wipes and other items are still being found in the system. Flushing items other than the 3 P's can result in widespread damage to hitaču's pipes and will cost a considerable amount to repair.

In light of the circumstances, the Centre remains open for regular business hours to the community (Monday to Friday, 8:00am to 4:30pm). We thank you for your patience and understanding.
