Community Trailers

A community notice was issued on Wednesday, October 5, contents were as stated below:

"Occupants of trailers on Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government owned lands (i.e. those lands that have not been granted fee simple or are properties that have social housing or YG rental units) are in violation of section 6.2(a)(i) of the Community Safety and Trespass Act; a person must not without lawful authority occupy Yuułu?ił?atḥ Lands. Any new trailers will not be permitted access to Yuułu?ił?atḥ Lands.

Trailers are classified as a recreational vehicle (non-automotive or automotive) served to park as a temporary dwelling, and include travel trailers, 5th wheels, motorhomes, and RV's.

Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government Administration have been directed to establish a temporary

re-location for current trailers on Yuułu?ił?atḥ owned lands, further preparing plans for a future, community trailer park.

The plans to place a temporary plot of land is underway and those in violation of the law noted above will be served with formal notice in the near future.

In the meantime, residents are advised to refrain from bringing in any trailers as outlined in this notice and encouraged to call the main office at 250-726-7342 with any questions. Please ask for Zoltan Schafer, Director of Lands and Resources or Suzanne Williams, Director of Operations."

The notice was issued to deter the influx of trailers in to the community, directed to those residing on Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government owned lands.

The good news: land is being sought out to offer a short term, temporary, solution for owners/residents of trailers.


The great news: a long term plan is being drafted to build a functioning trailer park for community residents!

Ucluelet & Area Historical Society

The Ucluelet and Area Historical Society is hosting a Japanese Internment Story Telling event; Japanese Canadian Internment Effects on Ucluelet – Three Perspectives. The concept is to Remember, Recount and Reconcile.

The Historical Society invites you to join in person or by Zoom on **Saturday, October 29th**, for an all-day Round-Table storytelling event, focused on the effects of the removal in 1942 of all Japanese Canadians from the West Coast, Ucluelet.

Among the invitee list of encouraged participants are survivors of that time, descendants, and others, to meet for the day. Participants are encouraged to bring stories, photos, letters and journals, and other memorabilia to share. The Historical Society will also have photos on display.

This event is open to all interested people, whether they choose to actively participate by sharing stories and memories, or whether they are there to listen and learn.

The facilitator for the event will be Paul Kariya, a negotiator with the BC Government regarding the \$100 Million Redress Fund announced in May. Paul grew up in Ucluelet and has returned to live part-time in the community.

When you register, you may also add why you are interested in attending and if you have any questions you would like to be addressed. This is not mandatory, but welcome.

The Day's Events

The day will begin with a welcome from the Ucluelet First Nation, a welcome from the Ucluelet and Area Historical Society, and an introduction to the day's proceedings by the facilitator.

After introductions, there will be three short introductory talks, on the perspectives of the three Ucluelet Community groups of that time: The First Nations Community, the Japanese Canadians, and the white Settlers.

Introductions will be followed by a break, with facilitated conversations on the relationships of the three community groups.

After lunch, facilitated conversations and discussions will continue.

The plan is for a relaxed environment in which participants feel comfortable sharing their perspectives.

The day will then wrap up with evaluation of objectives set by participants at the start, and ideas for any next steps.



hitacu Quarry Regulation

The Yuułu?ił?atḥ Executive enacted the government's 56 regulation with the hitaċu Quarry Regulation YFN6 56/2022.

The hitacu Quarry Regulation, enacted by the Executive on September 20, 2022, adds a secondary use in zoning district HL1 (Homelands 1)*, for the extraction of aggregate from pits and quarries to be used in relation to the construction of housing or other buildings and structures on Yuulu?ił?ath Lands for citizens, the Yuulu?ił?ath government or businesses, which may not be sold.

*Homelands (HL1), in accordance to the Zoning and Structures Act YFNS 51/2016, is established to assist the Yuułu?ił?atḥ government to achieve certain goals and objectives identified for home and community lands under section 4.1 of Schedule 1 to the Official Community Plan Act, and economic development under section 4.4 of Schedule 1 to the Official Community Plan Act.

HL1 is to provide a zoning district for low density residential use for single family homes. A lot in zoning district HL1 may be occupied for a primary use and a permitted secondary use.

The primary use of a lot in zoning district HL1 is residential use, with only one single unit dwelling.

The following uses are permitted as a secondary use on a lot in zoning district HL1:

(a) a secondary building and its related use which, for certainty, includes a dock, wharf or berth facility on a lot fronting the ocean

- (b) a bed and breakfast operation
- (c) a child day care
- (d) a home occupation
- (e) a secondary suite

And the new addition as of September 20, 2022:

(f) extraction of aggregate from pits and quarries, including gravel, stone and sand, and processing those subsurface resources, in accordance with all applicable laws.

The requirement that any aggregate extracted under this subsection:

- (i) must primarily be used in relation to the construction of housing on Yuułu?ił?atḥ lands for Yuułu?ił?atḥ citizens,
- (ii) may otherwise be used only in relation to the construction of administrative, community, recreational or commercial buildings and structures on Yuułu?ił?atḥ lands for a Yuułu?ił?atḥ institution, Yuułu?ił?atḥ citizens or a Yuułu?ił?ath business, and
- (iii) may not be sold.

Interested in working in childcare for your community? There is an Early Childhood Educators education opportunity with Vancouver Island University!

Vancouver Island University is pleased to be offering an ECEC (Early Childhood Education and Care) Online Certificate program from January 2023 to April 2024.

First Nations Health Benefits and Services

First Nations Health Benefits and Services (FNHBS) changed the temporary mileage reimbursement rate on **September 16, 2022**. This change was for the Medical Transportation (MT) benefit to remain responsive to fluctuating gas prices.

Effective September 16, 2022, the MT mileage rate changed from \$0.32 to \$0.29. This change will be in effect until November 30, 2022. The change will also apply to the special mileage rate applicable to certain remote communities.




