Äeekoo Äeekoo to all citizens who attended the Special Assembly, whether in person or via zoom. We apologize for the technical difficulty that delayed the start of the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned abruptly due to the majority requirement from the citizens to approve the agenda to proceed. We did not receive majority consensus to proceed.

It is with important reminder, this Special Assembly was held to seek comment from the citizens and provide a overview of the Referendum, with Legal Counsel in attendance.

When voting to adopt the agenda, this is not voting to pass the contents of the agenda, this vote passes the adoption/approval to proceed with the meeting.

By objecting to the agenda, we are restricted to move forward with the meeting.

There will be an additional Special Assembly

held on **Monday, April 17**, we encourage all who attended the first meeting to return, provide feedback, and learn more on the contents of the Referendum. An official notice is in this newsletter.

Please note: the Referendum package with information and voting details will be mailed out on March 10 by the Electoral Officer. From there, further communications will be released in April.

The deliveries of the Referendum package is separate from the Election package, which will be distributed in April.

hitacu has no chance when it snows.


Pictured left, Jordan Touchie takes to the streets of hitacu, with YG's officially un-official snow plow.

NTC Covid Vaccine Study

The NTC Research Group receive government support to proceed with Community based Research!

The Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council has been working in support of the Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government Health Department, to better understand the COVID-19 vaccination within the Ucluelet First Nation.

A research group from NTC recently visited the community at a community luncheon and dinner. Their goal was to interact with citizens to better understand the vaccine in relation to immune response, effectiveness, and safety. Speaking with citizens and answering questions.

After demonstrated community support at the two info sessions, Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government formally agreed to move ahead with the research project.

The next steps are to recruit Community Support Workers and members of the Health Research Working Group (see role descriptions below).

We will continue to share information with the community, and the Health Research Working Group will work with our research team to co-create the project and ensure all research activities are relevant and culturally appropriate for the community of hitaću.

Here are some bullets and role descriptions:

Community Support Workers

Community Support Workers to work closely with the NTC Community Based Researcher to help organize events and share information with community.

This is a part time/casual position that is compensated through a \$25/hour honorarium in gift card format.

Health Research Working Group

Health Research Working Group members will provide insight to the research team to finalize the relationship protocol and research agreement for the project.

They will work to ensure that the research activities are relevant to the people of Ucluelet First Nation as well as being culturally safe and appropriate. Members of the working group will be compensated by honorarium in line with Nation's guidance.

We will continue to nurture and work on the land behind hitaću.



Warriors Clam Garden Harvest





Notice of Election

There will be a general election for the office of President and six (6) Members of the Legislature for the Yuułu?ił?atḥ First Nation on May 10, 2023.

A **Voters List** for these elections has been posted in hitaçu in the cixwatin centre and on the YFN web site at http://www.ufn.ca and is updated regularly. Citizens for whom address information is missing are noted on the list. If you have any information about these people please contact the Law Clerk, Jill Hamilton at 250-726-7342 or by email at jill.hamilton@ufn.ca.

An **All Candidates Meeting** at which you can meet the candidates and ask questions will be held on April 26, 2023 from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. in the cixwatin centre in hitaçu.

Eligible voters may vote in person at the General Poll or the Advance Poll, by mail-in ballot, or by electronic voting.

An **Advance Poll** will be held in hitaçu in the cixwatin centre on April 28, 2023 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Mail-in ballot packages will be sent to eligible voters on April 10 and mail-in ballots must be received by the Chief Electoral Officer before the close of the general poll at 8:00 p.m. on May 10, 2023.

Electronic voting will available from 8:00 am Monday, May 1, 2023 to the close of the polls at 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday May 10, 2023. Voters will be provided with a PIN and instruction for electronic voting.

The **General Poll** shall be held in hitaçu in the cixwatin centre from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on May 10, 2023. An additional polling station will also be established at the Yuułu?ił?atḥ Government satellite offices at 3203 3rd Ave. Port Alberni This polling station will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on May 10, 2023.

Nominations

Any eligible Yuułu?ił?atḥ voter may nominate a Yuułu?ił?atḥ citizen who qualifies under Section 4.1 of the Elections Act (see attached) by completing, signing and witnessing a **Nomination Form** and a **Voter Declaration Form**.

The nomination must also include a **Support for Nomination** form with the signatures of ten (10) Yuulu?il?ath citizens, three (3) of whom must not be

ordinarily resident on Yuułu?ił?atḥ lands, indicating their support for the nomination. Each sponsor must complete and sign a **Voter Declaration Form**.

These forms must be completed and submitted to the Chief Electoral Officer before 4:30 p.m. on March 24, 2023. The forms can be scanned and emailed to yfn_elections_officer@shaw.ca. An election official will be available in the administrative offices in hitaçu in the cixwatin centre to receive nominations from 1:00 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. on March 24th.

Note: This is a change from previous elections. The **Nomination Form**, the **Support for Nomination** form signed by ten (10) eligible Yuułu?ił?atḥ voters, three (3) of whom are not ordinarily resident on Yuułu?ił?atḥ lands, **and Voter Declaration forms** from the person making the nomination and all the people who signed in support of the nomination must be submitted at the time of the nomination, no later than 4:30 p.m. on March 24, 2023.

The Nominee must provide an **Acceptance of Nomination Form**, a **Voter Declaration Form**, a **Declaration of Eligibility as a Candidate Form** sworn before a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or Commissioner for Oaths, and a statement of motivation for candidacy indicating the reason for accepting the nomination and seeking the office. These forms will be available from the election official on March 24 and will be posted on the Web site.

The Nominee must also provide a non-refundable deposit of \$300 for candidates for President and \$200 for candidates for member of the Legislature. Nomination fees must be payable to the Ucluelet First Nation Government.

The complete acceptance of nomination package including the **Acceptance of Nomination Form,** a **Voter Declaration Form,** a **Declaration of Eligibility as a Candidate Form,** and a statement of motivation must be submitted submitted to the Chief Electoral Officer before 4:30 p.m. on April 3, 2023. The forms can be scanned and emailed to yfn_elections_officer@shaw.ca. An election official will be available in the administrative offices in hitaçu in the cixwatin centre to receive acceptance of nominations from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. on April 3rd.
